THE YEAR IN REVIEW



2024 was a year that sparked more support for underrepresented and First Generation youth wanting to go to college.



More laptops than ever were provided to our neediest students. A laptop is an essential tool to store coursework, collaborate, and develop projects for college success. The laptops are refurbished but meet specifications that make them college-ready.



Our increase in scholarships removes some of the financial stress students experience. Lack of finances can cause students already marginalized to fall through the cracks and perhaps not complete a postsecondary school at all.



We built partnerships with other organizations like Mesa West Rotary to enhance the resources available to RISE Scholars.

Summer Highlight

A new scholarship was added to help seniors for Fall 2024. The Dianna L. Sharps Achieve scholarship is renewable up to four years.

Winter Highlight

A partnership with Mesa West Rotary was launched to benefit Mesa unaccompanied youth in the McKinney-Vento program.


Spring Highlight
